The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) II provides emergency funding to universities to assist students in need during the coronavirus pandemic. In 2020, this funding was known as the CARES Act Funding.

Young Harris College has received \$550,660 of HEERF II funding through the CRRSAA to distribute student emergency grants ranging from \$333 to \$1,250 to eligible students to be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.

Funds from the CRRSAA are not considered financial aid and do not affect a student's current or future financial aid eligibility. Per guidance from the federal government, these grants were distributed to our students with exceptional need, which were identified by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). A separate email notification was sent to each student who is receiving funding.

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

On April 13, 2021, Young Harris College drew down its authorized allocation totaling \$509,660 as designated under the CRRSAA program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSAA program.

On April 13, 2021, Young Harris College drew down its authorized allocation totaling \$509,660 as designated under the CRRSAA program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA program as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).

On April 14-16, 2021, Young Harris College distributed the total \$509,660 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA program.

Because no student is required to file a FAFSA, the estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV cannot be determined.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA program.

A total of 677 Young Harris College students received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant.
