The **Mainstage Season** features four marquee-style musicals and plays directed and designed by faculty, professional artists, or advanced upperclassmen.



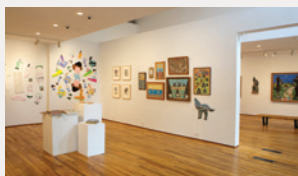
The **Second Season** includes exciting and innovative events like musical revues and cabarets, staged readings, one-act plays, and special performances.

8/27-9/24 Rachel Watson "I'm Gonna Send You to Milledgeville"

Rachel Watson is a North Carolina-based contemporary artist and arts administrator whose interdisciplinary practice spans installation, alternative photography, printmaking, woodworking, jewelry, book arts, and textiles. Her recent work centers on Central State Hospital in Milledgeville, Georgia, where she documents the abandoned institution and honors the lives of the patients once confined there. Through drone photography, Super 8 film, plaster casts, silicone molds, and extensive archival research, she seeks to restore individuality to people long reduced to numbers, exploring themes of memory, erasure, and the ethics of preservation. Watson holds an MFA from the University of Georgia and has worked with the Newcomb Art Museum and the John C. Campbell Folk School. She is the Founder and Executive Director of Elf School of the Arts, owner of Elf Hall, and Executive Director of the Cherokee County Arts Council, committed to building inclusive, sustainable creative communities.

10/1-10/29 Justin Archer Stratified Histories

Justin W. Archer is an Atlanta based sculptor whose work explores the fragility, beauty, and paradoxes of the human experience. A 2016 MFA graduate of the University of North Texas and now a Professor of Sculpture, he exhibits nationally with works held in collections including the SCAD Museum of Art, Texas Tech University, and Thompson Buckhead. Archer creates life size figures through a hybrid process that merges 3D scanning, digital construction, and traditional wood carving in Basswood and Walnut. Carefully rendered details contrast with digital fragmentation, capturing bodies in states of transformation and reflecting on the evolving relationship between technology, nature, and the human form. His current project, Stratified Histories, reimagines classical sculptures from the Carlos Museum by translating digital scans into wood and bronze, examining how fractured artifacts—and the echoes they carry—shape memory, continuity, and our search for coherence within the fragmented.

Posters are one of the most universal forms of design, appearing in streets, classrooms, protests, theaters, and digital spaces. They communicate quickly across language and culture, using image, typography, and symbolism to make ideas visible and values legible. This exhibition gathers posters from around the world to show how designers respond to their communities and the challenges of their time. Together, these works reveal the enduring power of posters as tools for storytelling, connection, and change. Visitors can explore how design shapes public space, influences opinion, builds solidarity, and continues to evolve in digital environments while remaining rooted in public communication.

11/11-14 Turn of the Screw

Jeffrey Hatcher's *The Turn of the Screw* is a popular theatrical adaptation of Henry James's classic gothic horror novella, known for its suspenseful and ambiguous ghost story, performed by a small cast who play multiple roles, exploring themes of innocence, corruption, and the supernatural. The play follows a young governess at a remote English estate who believes the children she cares for are being haunted by the ghosts of the former governess and valet, forcing her to question if the spirits are real or a product of her own mind.

YHC dance students take the stage in a dynamic showcase featuring work from the Tap & Jazz I and Choreography classes. This concert highlights their growth, technique, and artistic voice in an evening full of movement and momentum.

Jason Robert Brown's *The Last Five Years* is an intimate, two-person musical tracing the rise and fall of a five-year relationship between novelist Jamie Wellerstein and actress Cathy Hiatt. Told through intersecting timelines — Jamie moving forward from their first meeting and Cathy moving backward from their breakup — their stories connect only once, at their wedding. Inspired by James Robert Brown's own failed marriage, the piece offers a raw, funny, and deeply honest look at love, ambition, and heartbreak. Since its 2002 Off Broadway premiere, its emotional score and inventive structure have captivated audiences around the world.

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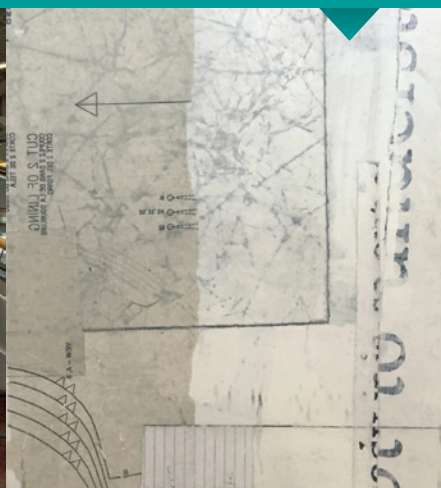

1/21-2/19 **Matt Monk Art Exhibition**

Matthew Monk is a visual artist, graphic designer, and educator based in Winston Salem, North Carolina, known for collage and mixed media works held in collections across the U.S. and abroad. A longtime faculty member in the MFA in Graphic Design program at Vermont College of Fine Arts and former Academic Dean, he previously taught for two decades at Rhode Island School of Design. Monk's award winning book design practice includes projects for the National Gallery of Art, Yale University Press, and Harvard Graduate School of Design. In his studio work, he transforms discarded and weathered materials through layered processes of painting, scraping, sanding, tearing, and patching. His compositions explore the tension between decay and order, uncovering meaning in the overlooked and value in the cast off. Each piece reveals a rich history through accumulated marks, where imperfection and structure meet in a dynamic, evolving dialogue.

The YHC Concert Band invites you to enjoy an evening of works that celebrate and pay homage to substantial musical artists and their influence.



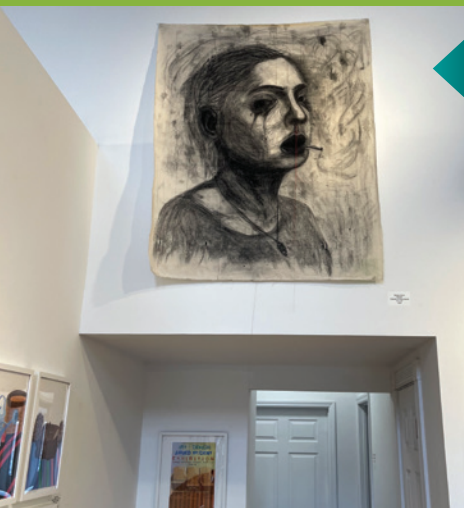
3/16 Spring Choral Concert: Homecoming

Set in 1930s St. Louis, it follows the Wingfield family — narrator Tom, his mother Amanda, and his shy sister Laura — as they grapple with poverty, illusion, and the harsh realities of life, with Laura's collection of glass animals symbolizing her fragile world. The play explores themes of memory, longing, and familial obligation through its poetic and poignant storytelling.

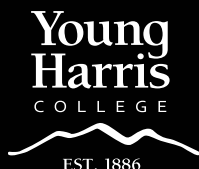
