# **Investigative Process**

No conflict of interest or bias

Reasonable prompt time frames

No gag order

Written notice required

Presumption of not responsible

Rights of Complainant and Respondent

Informal Resolution

Not permitted to require as condition of employment or continuing in education program

Not permitted to resolve allegations that employee sexually harassed a student

Formal Resolution

Inspect and review evidence

# 2021 Title IX Hearing Panel Member Training

This training provided Hearing Panel Members, Appeal Officers, Advisors, Title IX Coordinators, Deputy Coordinators, Investigators, HR personnel, and anyone associated with administering Title IX with an up-to-date understanding of current compliance requirements for the live hearing using a scenario-based training.

This training utilized newly developed training videos detailing an interesting fact pattern. Attendees will watch the hearing panel videos; discuss the burden of proof to be established; make rulings on evidentiary matters; and develop strategies to control unruly participants. The training will conclude with the participants arriving at a written decision based on the facts.

For participants who attended the Title IX Investigator Training, this training was not a repeat of what we discussed in that training. These are different videos, however, the fact pattern is the same with a few twists.
